Four Characteristics of God's Name

They Won't Believe Me. Exodus 3:13-15.

- 1. This name separates God from the other false gods.
- 2. God's existence has no extension in time.
- 3. God is always the same.
- 4. God is the only one with the power to act on behalf of the people.



The definition of Incarnation is "to take flesh." It's the theological concept that Jesus was both fully divine and fully human.
